What is the Learning Centre?

The Learning Centre is a resourced provision for pupils between the ages of seven and eleven, who experience moderate learning difficulties. The Centre is an accessible, inclusive and integral part of the main school. A warm welcome is extended to all. We are a separately funded unit within the school with places for up to 10 pupils.

A team of highly skilled staff work with parents, carers and others to ensure that all aspects of our education match the individual needs of our pupils. The excellent quality of our teaching enables pupils to make progress and achieve goals.

It is purpose built and includes the following;

- Interactive White board that is height adjustable.
- Internet access
- A high ratio of laptops: children, so that the pupils can use them in the mainstream to support their learning elsewhere.
- High interest, ability and age appropriate resources.
- Totally accessible to the main school and grounds.
- Dedicated, specialist staff team.
